## cvc nonsense word reading

－no＇$y$＇，＇$v$＇，＇$j$＇，＇$h$＇as final letter as these letters don＇t usually occur in the English language after short vowels．
－no final＇$f$＇，＇$l$＇，＇s＇，＇$z$＇，as these letters typically double when following a short vowel．
－no final＇$c$＇or $k$ as these letters become the digraph ck following a short vowel．
－no final＇$w$＇or＇$r$＇as these letters typically alter the sound of a proceeding short vowel．
－No initial＇x＇letters as this letter doesn＇t appear at the beginning of words．

## cvc－consonant doubles and consonant digraphs

－＇qu＇only appears at the beginning of a word in English．
－＇$n g$＇only appears at the end of a word in English．
